LIME AND COCONUT LOAF RECIPE

Ingredients

4oz/100grams Margarine 4oz/100 grams Caster Sugar 1oz/25 desiccated Coconut Grated rind of 1 Lime 2 Eggs

4oz/100 grams SR Flour

1 TBS milk

Topping

2TBS Caster Sugar
Juice of 1 lime
Desiccated Coconut

Method

- 1. Cream all ingredients together and spoon into a lined 1lb loaf tin.
- 2. Bake at 180°C / 350°F /Gas 4 for approx. 45 minutes.
- 3. Meanwhile mix together the sugar and lime juice for the topping ready to spoon over the loaf whilst it is still warm. Then sprinkle with the coconut.
