BYE-LAWS OF THE BORDER UNION AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY

1. All Animals shown to take their ages from 1st January, if not otherwise stated.
2. Cattle and Goats: the age of animals **must** be given on the Entry Form.
3. Animals must be the bona fide property and in the possession of the Exhibitors from the entry date.
4. All Entries must be made on the appropriate forms and submitted to the Border Union Agricultural Society, Kelso, not later than 5.00 p.m. on Monday 23rd June. **If completing a paper application form please fill in your entry form, taking care to write legibly, completing all the necessary details such as animal name, breeding, registration numbers, date of birth and so forth. Alternatively, application can be submitted online via our website – www.borderunion.co.uk. No late entries or telephone entries will be accepted at any time.**
5. Exhibitors who have not paid their Entry fees shall not be entitled to compete.
6. **There can be no substitution of named entries in any Section. If there should be such a substitution the animal will be disqualified.**
7. **Any animal not entered may not be shown. If there should be such a case, at the Discretion of the Directors, all the animals from the Exhibitor will be disqualified.**
8. All Animals, Machinery and Equipment admitted to the Showground will remain entirely at the risk of their Exhibitors who must take charge of their property at all times.
9. All Exhibits must be in the Showground at least one hour before judging is due to commence on Friday 25th July and by 8.30 a.m. on Saturday 26th July.
10. Exhibitors must remain in charge of their exhibits until the end of the Show.
11. Admission tickets will be sent to Exhibitors prior to the Show. Attendants CANNOT obtain free admission to the Showground unless such a ticket is produced. The number of tickets allocated to exhibitors will be based, pro rata, on the total number of entries.
12. The Judges shall have the power to withhold any prizes should they think the Exhibits are not deserving of them. The Judges are particularly requested to satisfy themselves, as far as possible, regarding the soundness of all Horses before awarding the prizes, and to avoid giving preference to animals showing symptoms of hereditary diseases. Judges may consult the Society's Veterinary Surgeons if they deem it expedient. **No protests on veterinary grounds will be considered.**
13. During the judging of stock, no person will be allowed in the Ring except Judges, Stewards and Attending Members of the Class being judged. Attending Members will enforce this Bye-Law.
14. Judges who wish the assistance of another Judge shall have the power to choose one, and it is the duty of the Attending Member to see that the Judge so chosen has no personal interest in the exhibit to be judged. **Judges shall not place animals that they have bred or owned at any time.**
15. All disputes and any objections to the decision of the Judges, shall be referred to the Society Directors, by whom they shall be finally settled, without appeal. Any dispute or objection must be lodged with the Secretary, in writing, within 24 hours from the date of the Show, accompanied by a deposit of £50.00, which is liable to forfeit if the objection is not upheld.
16. All Cups and Trophies offered for competition at the Show are the property of the Border Union Agricultural Society and are awarded annually in perpetuity. They must be returned to the Secretary not less than three weeks before the Show.
17. All animals, except horses, shall remain in their pens or stances until at least after the Parade on Saturday 26th July.
18. Prize-winning Horses, Cattle and Goats must take part in the Grand Parade on Saturday 26th July.
19. **Judges have the authority to ask for the removal of any animal from the Show Ring.**
20. **Long Service Medallists** will be given free Admission. **Tickets on application in writing to the Secretary.**
21. The Trustees, of the Border Union Agricultural Society accept no responsibility whatever for loss, injury or damage to any person, animal or property on the Showground or the approaches thereto.
22. If we are compelled to cancel the event, or sections of the event, due to APHA regulations, entry fees for relevant sections will be refunded in full.
23. Entries will not be permitted from Bluetongue restriction zones, and any entries that are subsequently re-zoned after entry, will be refunded.

PLEASE BE ADVISED: Due to shortage of space, only vehicles transporting horses and ponies will be permitted to park in the Showground. All other vehicles must use the public car park.

PLEASE NOTE THAT IN THE INTERESTS OF HEALTH AND SAFETY, WITH THE EXCEPTION OF GROOMS WHEN REQUIRED, ONLY BUAS OFFICIALS ARE ALLOWED TO ENTER THE RINGS DURING JUDGING

Correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats that meet one of the following current Safety Standards as of 01/01/2024 **MUST** be worn by all Riders: – SNELL E2016 onwards, EN1384 2023, ASTM F1163 2015 & 2023, AS/NZS 3838 2006 onwards, PAS015 2011, VG1 (BS).

NOTES FOR GUIDANCE

- **ALL HORSES AND PONIES MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY THEIR PASSPORT AT THIS SHOW**
- Foals must accompany Mares in the Ring and be at least four weeks old on the day of the Show, or in accordance with the relevant Breed Societies' rules.
- **All Horses and Ponies MUST be fully vaccinated against Equine Influenza within the last 12 months prior to the Show, Passports will be spot checked by Vets. All horses and ponies using racecourse stabling facilities must hold the mandatory vaccinations against equine influenza administered within the last 6 months.**
- Exhibitors must abide by the Registration & Stallion Licensing rules of their individual Breed Society.
- **All Registered Horses and Ponies must be registered in their Breed Society Stud Books and the number given on the entry form**
- **The Directors reserve the right to cancel, amalgamate or divide classes according to the number of entries forward.**
- Judging times are approximate. Variations may occur according to the number of entries forward.
- Handlers of Ponies in In Hand Classes aged 14 years and under must wear correctly secured current British Standard skull caps / riding hats.
- No horses or ponies to be left tied to the side of a vehicle and NO corrals allowed.

NPS Qualifying Rounds: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in any of the British Riding Pony studbook sections or the Ridden Register; the GSB; the AHSB; the AASB, or registered in the main body of their respective M&M Stud Book. Part-breds are not eligible unless over stamped into one of the British Riding Pony Studbook sections. or the Ridden Register. Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members but only ponies owned by adult NPS Qualifying or Life members are eligible to qualify for the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show at Malvern from 5th – 7th August 2025. The highest placed pony, if owned by an NPS member, in each class will qualify for the final. Qualification may pass down to third place if the first and second ponies are already qualified.

NPS Silver Medal Rosette Championships: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. NPS Silver Medal Rosettes are only awarded when the owner of the champion pony is a Qualifying or Life member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the rider's/handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the owner of the Champion pony is not a member, or the owner's membership card is not immediately produced, the rosette may be awarded to the Reserve Champion provided they have the required membership card. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette, but the qualification card goes to the Reserve Champion pony, provided the owner of that pony is a member of the NPS. The Silver Medal Rosette and the qualification card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve (third). Foals are not eligible for Silver Medal Championships. Qualifiers are entitled to compete in the final of the Silver Medal Rosette Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show 5th – 7th August 2025.

NPS Scotland / Kingfisher Building Products Mountain & Moorland Open WHP Championship

The Stallions, mares and geldings five years old or over, registered in the main body of their respective Breed Society stud book. The 2 highest placed ponies, in each class not already qualified, will qualify for the Final which will take place at the Scone Palace International Horse Trials on 22nd August 2025. Qualifications to go no lower than 4th place.

NPS Scotland / Craigclowan School M&M Lead Rein & First Ridden Championship

The 2 highest placed ponies in the Lead Rein Class not already qualified will go forward to the final which will take place at the Scone Palace International Horse Trials on 22nd August 2025. Qualifications to go no lower than 4th place.

This Show is a qualifying round for the **British Connemara Pony Society 'Tam O'Shanter Breeding Championships'** - kindly sponsored by **Eastern Connemara Group** to be held at the **annual BCPS Breed Show in July 2026**, date and venue to be advised on the **BCPS website nearer the time.**

Youngstock Class - The three highest placings of each age group - Connemara yearlings and two year olds – will qualify for the Tam O'Shanter Breeding Championship (9 qualifiers).

Mare Class - The three highest placed Connemara Mares - will qualify for the Tam O'Shanter Breeding Championship (3 qualifiers).

The Champion and Reserve Champion from the Riding Pony Breeding, Hunter Pony Breeding and Mountain & Moorland In Hand Classes will qualify for the Final to be held on Monday 25th August 2025 at the NPS Area 4 Summer Show. Qualifiers do not have to be Members of the NPS.

HIGHLAND PONY SOCIETY YOUNGSTOCK CHAMPIONSHIP

- This show is a qualifier for the 2025 Highland Pony Society Youngstock Championships.
- The Champion youngster across these classes will qualify for the Highland Pony Youngstock Championships. If already qualified, the card will pass to the second placed pony but no further.
- Only purebred registered Highland youngstock; foals, 1, 2 and 3yrs olds may enter.
- Two Championships will be held; one in Scotland (CSHPC Show at Strathallan Castle on 7th September 2025) and one in England (HPEC Autumn Show, Mill Lane, Selby on 21st September 2025). The qualifying exhibitor can select which Championship Show they wish to enter.
- Exhibitors are not required to be members of the Highland Pony Society for qualifying classes. However, all those competing in the Championships must be members of the Society.
- Entry to the Championships is free.
- At the Youngstock Championships, the Champions and Reserves will receive rosettes and prize money of £100 and £50 respectively and all those forward at the finals will receive £15 and a finalist rosette. A sash and perpetual trophy will be awarded to each of the Champions.

Caledonian Showing Championships

Every horse & pony placed 1st in all In hand, Ridden Showing classes (not fun classes) & Working Hunter/Pony classes will qualify to compete in any appropriate class at the Finals. All Champions & Reserves will qualify for the Champion & Reserves Stakes Finals. Qualification will be from placings, no qualification cards will be awarded in the ring, and no qualification can go down the line. All qualified horses and ponies will be listed on the Puddledub Show's Facebook page and the website <https://puddledubshows.weebly.com/>



This Show is Affiliated to the British Show Pony Society and all persons entering, competing, showing or otherwise taking part in the B.S.P.S. Classes, whether or not Members of the B.S.P.S. are subject to the Constitution and Rules of the B.S.P.S., including disciplinary procedures, and shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the B.S.P.S.

Body Protectors MUST be worn when jumping in any WHP and WH classes Including practice rings at B.S.P.S. affiliated shows. (Including Tiny Tots, Cradle and Nursery Stakes, WSP, LRWSP and Training Stakes). Riders must wear a body protector when working in (practice jumps) and the jumping phase in all B.S.P.S. organised and affiliated events. A British Equestrian Trade Association (BETA) approved and appropriately labelled "Level 3 body protector" 2018 (Blue and Black) shown on the label. BETA recommends body protectors are replaced at least every three to five years, after which the impact absorption properties of the foam may have started to decline. All types of Air Jackets are not allowed.

Correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats Nos. PAS015 2011, VG1, (BS) EN1384 2023, ASTM F1163 2015 and 2023, SNELL E2016 and E2021, AS/NZS 3838 2006, MUST be worn by riders at all times when mounted. Hats should have a plain cover, either Black, Navy Blue, Brown, Grey or Green. Velvet covers

are encouraged. The B.S.P.S. encourages members to have their hats tagged through the B.S.P.S. scheme or via the Pony Club Scheme. Tagging indicates that the hat meets the accepted standards, no check of the fit or condition of the hat is implied. It is considered to be the responsibility of the members/guardians to ensure the hat complies with the current standards and is tagged before they compete. Members/guardians are responsible for ensuring the manufacturer's guidelines with regard to fit and replacement are followed. Hat Tagging in B.S.P.S. classes is compulsory at BSPS Winter, Summer and Heritage Championship shows, Royal International Horse Show, London International Horse Show, Burghley Gold Cup and lead rein WSP final. (We are accepting British Eventing, British Riding Club and Pony Club tags)
